THE BEST LAID PLANS

The Scottish poet Robert Burns wrote the poem entitled, "To a Mouse," in which we find a most memorable line. In the original writing, this is how it reads, "The best laid schemes o' Mice an' Men Gang aft agley, An lea'e us nought but grief an' pain, For promis'd joy!" If those Scottish words do not compute perhaps the English translation will help clarify Robert Burn's meaning. "The best laid schemes of mice and men go oft awry, and leave us only grief and pain, for promised joy."

The poet recognized a commonality between himself and the lowly mouse. One of the themes of the poem is the mouse seeking only to survive. The tiny creature sees the coming Winter and shelters himself the best he knows how, by heaping up leaves and stubble in which to be protected. Yet, in the midst of his supposed warmth and safety, an iron plow rips through his shelter leaving him in a vulnerable, sorry state. The creatures best laid plans, through no fault of his own, certainly had gone awry.

We too can identify with the mouse. Think about all the plans that have been made that have been cancelled, through no fault of our own, due to the COVID -19 (Coronavirus). We hear news about the cancelling of Church Services, weddings, conferences. We hear about the closing of Theme Parks, Restaurants and other public gathering places. The list goes on and on including even my installation as the Pastor here at Concordia. These are uncharted waters for us all and can cause us to live in fear. In the midst of cancelled plans and seeming chaos we look to others for answers. We need to be in fervent prayer for those who are working tirelessly to find a cure and/or effective preventative measures for this virus.

However, there is one event that cannot be cancelled and that is the Resurrection of our Savior. Even if our Churches are empty on Easter Morning we can still sing with all joy and confidence, "Jesus Christ is Risen Today." And in a strange way the sad possibility of an empty Church on Easter is an odd reminder of the empty tomb. It is precisely in the promise of the Resurrection that we find our God to be faithful to His

promises. He promised a Savior who would give Himself as the sacrifice for our sins and on Good Friday it was finished, (John 19:30). He promised the Holy Spirit to be our Comforter and in Holy Baptism that promise is kept, (Acts 2:38). Jesus made the promise that He is with us always, (Matthew 28). Let us all live in God's peace and His comforting presence especially in these difficult times, knowing that His promise to never leave us nor forsake us is as sure as all of His promises. What, therefore, is our response to the events taking place in our world?


In answer to this, I have included a few words from the President of Concordia Seminary Dale Meyer's March 18th Daily Devotion.

In this Coronavirus crisis, a Christian makes a decision. Cast your lot with God and commend your life to Him, or live outside the fortress of faith where fears lurk everyplace. Understand, saving faith is not a decision we make, it's a gift of the Spirit, but a person who has been brought to saving faith will make daily decisions to live and demonstrate the trust in God that the Spirit gives. It is God who works in you both to will and to work for his good purpose (Philippians 2:13).

God alone is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore, we will not fear... (Psalm 46).

A most joyous and blessed celebration of our Savior's resurrection.

On Ash Wednesday, we sang these words:

The season of Lent is marked by the forty days that Jesus wandered in the wilderness being tempted by Satan. The hymn continues by saying:

Your faithfulness endured;

Use these last days of Lent to read through the Gospels and hear the story of Jesus' unfailing love. Use all the worship resources that have been created by the ministry staff found on the church website.

The hymn ends:
Be with us through this season, Lord,
And all our earthly days,
That when the final Easter dawns,
We join in heaven's praise. (LSB 418:4)

What a glorious Easter day it will be when our worship services can return to campus – what an even more glorious day when we worship around the throne in heaven on that final Easter. I miss you, I miss worshiping with you, and I can't wait to see you and see the transformation that has taken place in you, because of Jesus, during this season of Lent.



“The Seven Practices Healthy Congregations Have (for Youth)”

(the following article comes from “7 Practices of Healthy Youth Ministry,” p.4-5, published by The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, Youth Ministry Office © 2019 The Office of National Mission)

Engaged Parents: prioritize faith development; invest in the lives of their children; participate in worship, personal spiritual practices and service; receive parental support from other Christian adults!

Supportive Adults: develop not just short term, but long-term relationships; deliberately invest in youth and build intergenerational relationships; prepare for and respond to celebration, transitions and crisis; live in congregations that seek to connect youth with at least 5 engaged adults.

Warmth, Challenge & Grace Congregations: share personal stories of failure, grace & joy; foster an open & honest environment where youth share joys, questions, crisis, & doubt knowing God’s Word will be spoken in love; are willing to engage in tough spiritual conversations; create opportunities where failure is not avoided but met with grace & forgiveness.

Congregations Provide Opportunities to Serve and Lead: by identifying gifts and skills in youth that can be used in service, leadership and vocation inside and outside the church; invest in ways for youth to make meaningful contributions; provide adults who mentor youth into load-bearing leadership; give youth service and leadership experience with peers, parents, and supportive adults in ministry distinctly created by teens for teens.

Youth Deeply Understand their Baptismal Faith: youth live as forgiven sinners with the promise of eternal life through Jesus’ death and resurrection; recognize the work of the Holy Spirit; regularly worship, study the living and active Word of God; pray together and receive the Lord’s Supper faithfully; youth are provided with deliberate age specific opportunities to identify as a loved child of God, understand the importance of Christian community, have humble confidence and live out acts of service and mission to the world.

Develop a Resilient Identity in Christ: youth identify with the life and mission of the Christian Church; remain humbly confident in their faith; build relationships with those different than themselves and navigate disagreements in loving ways; lifelong learners who face doubt and challenge by turning to God’s Word.

Live Out Their Unique Vocation: youth understand their role as Christ’s hands and feet; reach out to their neighbor in word and deed; serve and lead their congregation and community; seek to be grace-filled to their peers; encouraged to pursue church work vocations.


Please note that no meeting is scheduled at this time for April.



On a beautiful spring day, we had 14 teams of five compete for the fastest time around the UCHIGHditarod course. We had students competing dressed up as farm animals, snowboarders, Noah and the animals, sharks, tennis players and the dominos. Some of the 10 events on the course were the Elephant March, Hop Pop Balloon, Knee Ball, Mukluks, Snowball Basketball, and Dizzy Bat. Awards were given for best costume and fastest time. Individuals and companies sponsored the event which allowed almost \$700 each to be given to the Salvation Army, the Corner Table and the Backpack Program ministries. There was also an amazing amount of food donated by the UCHS students that was given to these three organizations. While some students won prizes, the real winners are the families that will have something to eat because of this fun and meaningful event.

DEBATE TEAM EXCELS!

The hard-working members of the **UCHS Debate Team** have begun to see the rewards of their effort, holding their own in competition with much larger high schools at the Ardrey Kell HS Tournament last month.

At the Varsity level, the team of **Drew Pate** and **Eli Hefner** took 8th place. Competing against thirty-one high schools from six states, this was an amazing finish for a school of our size! At the Novice level, the team of **Alex Black** and **Virginia Crooks** competed together for the first time and finished 11th out of the 27 Novice teams.

UCHS team **Drew Pate** and **Eli Hefner** and team **Aiden Kistler** and **Jacob VanMeter** both qualified for the NC District West, a two-day double-elimination tournament that qualifies students for Nationals. The team of Drew Pate and Eli Hefner made it to the third round. This is the first time a UCHS team has made it that far in the debate playoffs.

UCHS WINTER SPORTS WRAP-UP

- **Swim Team** had a dominating season. The Girls team won the All Catawba Meet against all the local public and private high schools. The boys came in second. Both the boys and girls teams captured the conference championships by a large margin. At the state meet the Girls won the state championship and the Boys came in 7th. A milestone season in the water! All-Conference selections were **Sarah Kelty, Zoe Coburn, Rachel Little, Emma Edwards, Margaret Johnson, Sean Kelty, Ben Simmons, Jackson Behmer, Henry Winfield, Baylor Texer, Benton Blair, Phillip Wilson, and Zack Johnson**. All-State selections were **Zoe Coburn, Emma Edwards, Rachel Little, Sarah Kelty, and Sean Kelty**.
- **Girls Basketball Team** finished with a 13-5 record and 2nd in the conference with a 4-2 conference record. They also hosted and won their first-ever home playoff game and advanced to the final 8 of the NCISAA playoffs. All-Conference selections were **Ally Deese, Sophie Deese, and Lizzie Sain**. **Ally Deese** was also the first basketball athlete in school history to be selected for the All-State Team.
- **Boys JV Basketball Team** finished the season 2-11. Their conference record was 0-6. They improved throughout the season, which is the goal for a JV team.
- **Boys Varsity Basketball Team** finished the season 10-12. We were 2-4 in the conference, finishing in third place. They hosted and won their first-ever NCISAA State Playoff game, advancing to the third round before losing to Northside Christian. **Jay Sowers** and **Wyatt Sain** were the All-Conference selections.
